

The Uniqueness & Opportunities of the L6 PHP Apprenticeships - Part 2



Continuing our discussions from the last issue about the uniqueness and opportunities this degree apprenticeship brings, let's look at the programme's potential of widening access into public health profession.

Typical routes into public health is varied and often stumbled upon during a career progression, and even when a role is found, most applicants lack the requisite experience to be considered. This story however changes with the introduction of the public health practitioner apprenticeship, widening access to individuals from different demographics and lived experiences to support the improvement of health and wellbeing within their local communities.

In as much as employing someone on an apprenticeship program, does not automatically get a permanent position within the employing organisation, it offers the organisation an opportunity to grow their own workforce.

- 2. Improve productivity and,
- 3. Improve quality of product and services.

It was such a pleasure to meet most of you at the recent employer engagement event. So many insightful contributions and ideas shared.


Invitations for expressions of interest to volunteer on the training provider selection panel were sent out immediately after the event. A panel is chosen and a dates set for the selection of a training provider.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the salary grade for the L6 PHP Apprenticeships?

<u>UCAS</u> observes that apprenticeship salaries vary dramatically and dependent on the sector, the employer and the level of study.

According to Health Education England, NHS Trusts pay different rates (under Agenda for Change (AfC)) for degree apprenticeships as seen below:

- Band 4 £21,892 £24,157
- Band 5 £24,907 £30,615
- Band 6 £31,365 £37,890
- Band 7 £38,890 £44,503

In relation to this apprenticeship, Public Health England Yorkshire and Humber advertised £23,139 to £28,195 for non-clinical and £24,907 to 30,615 for AFC5. For the same role, Hanham Secure Health in Bristol advertised £19,500.

Is UKPHR registration automatic after the apprenticeship training?

On completion of the end-point assessment (including a portfolio at gateway), practitioner registration with UKPHR will not be automatic, but apprentices are eligible to apply.

The UKPHR Board are still deciding exactly how this will work in practice but it has been proposed that there is a new route to UKPHR practitioner registration through the apprenticeship and apprentices will not have to complete further assessment if they can evidence passing the EPA.

The requirements for the portfolio of evidence are on the IfA website. This evidence will be built up throughout the apprenticeship and an apprentice will be supported by the employer and training provider to complete it.
