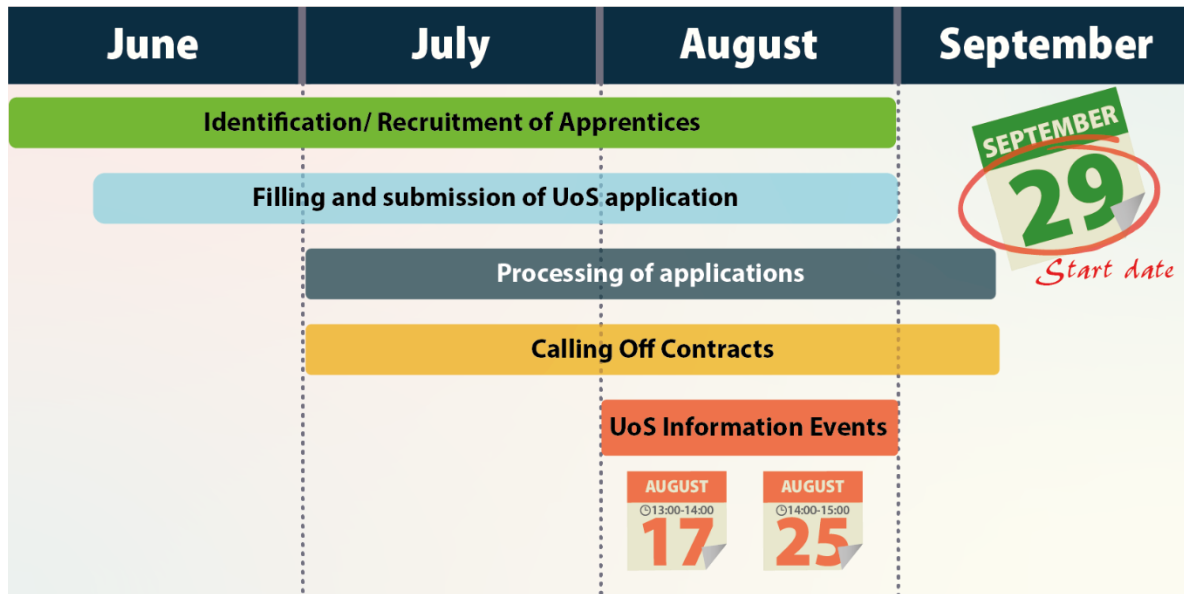

Recruitment & Prior Learning Assessments

We currently have a few of our employer group members actively recruiting. Consequently, there have been enquiries about the prior learning. The predominant concern has been applicants with masters (MSc) qualification.

The University of Sunderland (UoS) described the ideal candidate as one with the skillset(s) and experience(s) to competently perform on the job but have no qualifications or academic training to support the applied side of the job.

Concerning applicants with higher education, UoS will review applications on a case by case basis. Employers and applicants are also advised to do a skills, knowledge and behaviour scan using the [apprenticeship standard](#) or the [Public Health Skills and Knowledge Framework](#) as a

basis, to understand whether there is sufficient gaps in knowledge and skills or the workforce need to undertake the apprenticeship.

Paragraph 37 of the [Apprenticeship funding rules \(pg 10\)](#) stipulates a minimum of 12 months of new learning after prior learning has been considered.

For clarification on qualifications that might have crossover(s), the [apprenticeship standard](#) for this programme lists BSc (Hons) Public Health, BSc (Hons) Public Health and Health Promotion/ BSc (Hons) Health and Wellbeing as mandatory qualifications awarded after the end point assessment.

This also means that applicants with the above-mentioned qualifications (degrees) or MSc in a closely related subject e.g. Master of Public Health (MPH) will not be able to undertake the programme. Other related subjects will be reviewed either at application or through a prior learning assessment.
