Why do we need the website?

- Increase in paediatric ED attendances across
 SYB
- The challenge for families to navigate a multitude of providers and organisations
- Need for standardised resources for families about common illnesses, clearer guidance on local referral pathways for GPs
- Demand from parents for a central place for consistent information

What does the website address?

- Unwarranted clinical variation in quality and access across primary and secondary care
- Increasing demand for primary and secondary care which is unsustainable
- Unnecessary access to primary and secondary care
- Uncoordinated care between healthcare settings

The features of Healthier Together

- It is a locally editable web-based resource
- Red, amber, green system helps parents/carers make the right decisions for their children
- It provides a free SMS facility for information to be shared
- Local services directory
- Parent surveys indicate the impact of the content on parents' healthcare decisions
- It contains the web accessibility feature 'ReachDeck' which translates and reads out aloud text in over 70 languages and dialects
