

For the future of public health apprenticeships, we are looking forward to celebrating its interventive impact, especially in reducing health inequalities and disparities through unique attributes as seen below;


- 1. Pragmatic approaches to knowledge, skills, and behaviour development of the public health workforce.
- 2. Motivation boost at the workplace, resulting in increased staff retention.
- 3. Avenue(s) to create innovative roles that tackle health inequalities and other health concerns.
- 4. Improve social mobility by providing a route into employment for
 - a. People with lived experiences (ill health or impoverished communities)
 - b. Underrepresented groups or communities
 - c. Former volunteers
 - d. People who wish to start a career in health with little or no experience
- 5. Avenue(s) to enrich place-based partnerships through rotational apprenticeships, levy gifting and, social and corporate responsibility projects.
