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Supporting L6 PHP Apprenticeship Placement

The two level 6 Public Health Practitioner apprentices from UKHSA were recently started their placements at two different local authorities within the region.

As their roles are primarily focused on health protection, the module content served as guide to securing for placement opportunities for them.

The two apprentices are currently on a 6-week placement, with one requiring a number of face to face contact whilst the other is primarily a virtual placement.

Learning outcomes for the semester shared by the apprentices was shared with project leads to help them support the apprentices. See attached (Attachment 1) if you do not have it.

The apprentices were also advised to consider chronicling their experiences by either writing a report for both the project and their portfolio and seek the opportunity to present their learning to the team or wider audience they are working with.

In a conversation with another L6 apprentice chronicling their experiences through reflective writing, a senior colleague advised they considered using either <u>Gibbs</u>' or <u>Kolb's</u> reflective model as a guide.

Both apprentices are excited about the opportunities given them and are hopeful of the outcome.

News Updates

Highlights from recent UoS' Strategic Meeting

Starting on a positive note, Dr Shajee Hussain, the academic lead for Sunderland's L6 PHP apprenticeship program informed us that all apprentices passed their first semester assignments.

A key point briefly touched on was on attendance. As moving from online session to face to face sessions was overwhelmingly supported by the feedback from last semester, the university has indicated that there currently are regular absentees at face to face meetings. It was suggested that the possibility of this could be because the teaching sessions are recorded. They have advised they will be taking this up at tripartite meetings which will start soon.

Another thing mentioned at the meeting was the introduction of operational meetings to.

In contrast to mentor training which gives the underpinning knowledge of mentoring, operational meetings are proposed to support the day to day mentoring activities of apprentices.

The first operational meeting will be on Friday 29th April 2022.
