
# FAIRER FUTURES

### Introduction

In response to the pressing challenges faced by many Doncaster residents, the Fairness and Wellbeing Commission was established with a resolute purpose - to identify and address issues related to social and economic inequalities while promoting overall well-being in our city. As a collective endeavour, the Commission has embarked on an exploration of data, evidence and insight to create a fairer and more equitable community that thrives on unity and progress.

## **Commission Structure**

Chaired by Dame Rosie Winterton, the Commission has 17 permanent members from across Team Doncaster, Voluntary, Faith, Academic and Frontline organisations

Guest attendees are invited to individual meetings as subject matter experts on the topic being discussed.

The Chair of the Health and Well Being Board and Chair of the Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee; act as observers on the commission.




### Context

# Methodology

A mixed method approach to comprehensively assess the nature, extent, causes, and impact of fairness, wellbeing and social inequalities in Doncaster.

- Understand lived experience in an ethical way.
- Use life-stage approach to understand intersectionality of challenges.
- Consider recommendations in the context of 3 Horizons model.


