

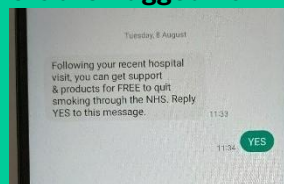
League table for Ward screening

To encourage ward staff to conduct smoking screening on admission a League table was introduced at Sheffield Teaching Hospitals with high performing wards getting recognition and a visit from the Chief Nurse.



Support to patients attending A&E

Doncaster and Bassetlaw are supporting patients identified as smokers, utilising an automated text service. A&E staff including reception staff are screening A&E attendees. Any smokers are flagged to the QUIT team who send an automated message via QUIT Manager. If a respondent answers YES the QUIT team makes a referral to the Community Stop Smoking Service. Between Apr-Jun 23, 2257 messages were sent resulting in 97 accepted referrals.



Maternity – Key Achievements to date

- Rotherham and Sheffield now refer 100% of women to a smokefree pregnancy pathway
- Barnsley have implemented an incentive scheme for pregnant women to quit smoking
- Specialist staff have had behavioural support training
- Sheffield direct supply NRT in all areas
- Doncaster, Barnsley and Sheffield support partners to quit

Behavioural Scientists commissioned to support QUIT programme

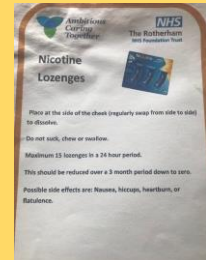
The ICB commissioned Behavioural Science support for the QUIT programme. Support was given to two trusts with a focus on engaging QUIT Champions at Sheffield Teaching Hospitals and increasing service uptake at Rotherham Hospital. A series of assets have been developed based on COM-B and behavioural science approaches and are currently in testing phase. If successful rollout will be across SY.



Training for ward based staff and medics

All of our Trusts have delivered extensive training to ward based staff including medics to ensure awareness around screening, VBA and NRT is embedded. Approaches include;

- Integration with induction modules
- Delivering training alongside mandatory modules
- Offering drop in sessions for ward staff with NRT questions
- Offering shadow opportunities within QUIT team to Junior Drs and trainee nurses
- Utilising huddles to deliver brief service updates, toolbox talks
- Handouts given to ward staff including key info

QUIT Champions

All Trusts have recruited QUIT Champions to raise awareness of the service and act as a key point of contact for ward staff. Champions undertake NCSCT training as part of their induction. Champions are recruited from all staff groups and are offered ongoing support and training opportunities from the QUIT team.



100% improvement in the provision of NRT

At Rotherham Hospital the provision of NRT within 24 hours of admission has DOUBLED in the Trust following the launch of a new Locally Agreed Protocol. The protocol supports appropriately skilled Tobacco Treatment Advisors and Nurses to provide NRT without the need for a prescription. More patients are being supported to stop smoking sooner.
