



Roles in health improvement

- Local authority
 - Public health team: assessing need, developing strategy, planning and commissioning services
 - Public health intelligence: analysing and interpreting data relating to health improvement
 - Other local authority teams: sports development, social care, environmental health, trading standards, licencing, parks, family services, communications and marketing
- Government departments: evidence base, policy advice, development and implementation
- NHS services: primary and secondary care, pharmacy, optometry, dentistry
- Public-facing services: public health nurses, health improvement practitioners, stop smoking advisors, walk leaders...











Vulnerable migrants - who do we mean?

- **Migrants** most come work/study fit and healthy
- **More vulnerable migrants** because of experiences before, during & after migration



Asylum seekers (a person who is seeking permission to stay in the UK)


Refugees (a person given permission to stay in the UK)

Unaccompanied children (any children under the age of 18 in the UK, who is a migrant and is without either parent or any legal guardian)

Trafficked migrants (a migrant who has been exploited through forced labour, modern slavery or prostitution whether to the UK or within the UK)


Undocumented migrant (those who are living in the UK with no legal status)


Low paid migrant workers




What we do ...

- Build capability in the system and facilitate collaborative working


