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

Mortality and multiple exclusion: the cliff edge effect








- Average age of death homeless 44 years vs average 78 years (pre- COVID)



Background:

- Ministerial decision to pause all moves out of supported accommodation at the start of lockdown resulted in supported asylum population increasing by 15% nationally
- C.9500 supported asylum seekers accommodated in Initial Contingency / Hotels nationally

 c.50% in London but also across the NE and Y & H.
- Accommodation moves for those with Leave to Remain in the UK resumed from September 2020
- No moves on Negative Decisions still

Objectives:

- Move supported asylum seekers from hotels into Dispersed Accommodation and divest use of hotels and other IA/Contingency
- All accommodation to meet AASC standards and supported asylum seekers to be accommodated in safe, secure accommodation and in liaison with LAs, Police and other statutory services

Supported by Deloitte - Timeline between March to June / 2021
